Dear Professor Joyce

I have talked with Polly Price about my intentions for the disposition of my oral history in the event I should die or become incapacitated before its completion.

The purpose of this letter is to confirm my intention that, at the time of my incapacitation or death, my complete oral history, or as much of my oral history as has been completed, along with the related materials, is to be donated to the American Society for Legal History. I hereby request and authorize my interviewer to provide to the Society at such time the recordings, transcripts, and/or other material documentation (including editorial changes which I ask my interviewer to make to correct typographical errors, misspellings, incorrect names, etc., in the transcript), and other tangible embodiments of the interviews of me conducted under the auspices of the Society's Oral History Project.


I hereby authorize the Society to publish, reproduce, distribute, perform, and otherwise use any portion of my oral history in any place and in any medium, including on its Website, except to the extent I have, during our recorded interviews, indicated that public access to some portion of an interview should be restricted in some manner. If I make such a request, I expect it to be honored by the Society. I also authorize the Society and its sublicensees to use my name, likeness, and biographical information to indicate the availability of my oral history.

Should any question arise relating to the donation of my oral history to the American Society for Legal History or public access to it, I authorize the Society and my

executor, heirs, or representative to resolve such matter in a reasonable manner in light of, and consistent with, my intentions expressed above.


Acknowledgment of Opportunity to Edit Oral History



Limitations on Oral History Agreement

(Please initial only those provisions that you wish to apply, and only if you wish to limit the use of your interview.)



4. ___ The Society shall not authorize publication of the transcript or any part thereof during my lifetime without my express written permission, but the Society may authorize scholars, researchers, and others to make reasonable quotations therefrom without my written permission.
5. ___ The Society shall not authorize publication by others of the transcript or any part thereof, including brief quotations, during my lifetime without my express written permission.
6. ___ I retain all of my rights, title and interest in the recordings, transcripts, and/or other material documentation of the interviews of me and their content, including literary rights and copyrights, until [date or event], at which time these rights shall vest in the American Society for Legal History.
7. ___ In the event of my incapacity, I designate _____ to make decisions respecting the use and disposition of the tape recordings, digital recordings, transcripts, computer diskettes, and DVDs of the interviews of me.

Upon the death or incapacity of this designee, I authorize the Society to make such decisions on my behalf.
